I am confident that in choosing The International School and Community College you will make a sound investment for the future of your child.

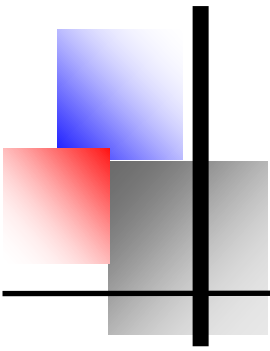

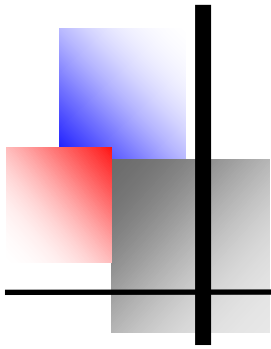


OUTSTANDING FACILITIES

The International School and Community College opened in 2001 as an 11-18 co-educational comprehensive school situated in the East Birmingham suburb of Shard End/Kitts Green. It is housed in five buildings on an adjacent site with approximately 1,000 students including 150 in the Sixth Form. It is a multi-cultural, multi-faith school with a wide mix of ability levels. It has a growing local and national reputation.

The school has excellent facilities:

- All subject areas suited in dedicated rooms with staff workrooms and storage areas.
- Ten ICT suites with full internet access, and computer networking in all classrooms.
- All teachers have laptop computers, and every classroom has a digital projector.
- A Learning and Study Support Centre equipped with computers and a well-stocked library staffed by a qualified librarian.
- Excellent specialist rooms for Technology, Science, Languages and Art.
- A suite of music rooms, and a Recording Studio.
- Fitness Suite
- Drama Studio and Editing Suite.
- Three separate gymnasiums.
- Brand new sports pitches and a Community Sports Pavilion
- A separate Sixth Form Centre with its own common room, internet provision, and ICT facilities.
- A new restaurant, and all students provided with a Cashless Card to cut down waiting times at lunchtime.
- A social space for students to use at lunchtime with a mobile library, games tables and social seating manned by a team of Youth Workers.



Be for Learning

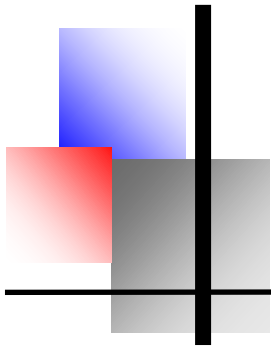
Be for Learning (Be 4 L) is the name we give to our whole school Behaviour and Discipline Policy.

Our Behaviour Policy is popular with parents, staff and students. Visitors to the school comment on the calm and well disciplined **atmosphere, and our recent Ofsted Report said that, "The introduction of Be 4 L has successfully achieved its aims, in a short time, of improving behaviour, as well as raising learning expectations."**

We believe students make conscious decisions about how to behave in school. We make clear that there are consequences for poor behaviour. We operate a sequence of consequences which include two verbal warnings, detention or a day in Isolation. If behaviour is more serious, students may be sent home to return with their parents, or they may receive a fixed term exclusion.

The Be 4 L rules are regularly explained to students. They are displayed in classrooms and corridors. Staff and students have a shared understanding of the standard of behaviour expected in school.





ADMISSIONS POLICY

The International School and Community College is a comprehensive school, open to girls and boys of all religions and backgrounds.

Admission to year 7 is through the Birmingham Admissions Office and follows current City Council policy. Admission to other year groups is by direct application to the school.

In the Autumn Term of Year 6 pupils at Birmingham Primary Schools receive details of how to apply for the High School of their choice.

You will have the opportunity to visit the school on one of our Open Mornings, or on our Open Evening, during the first half of the Autumn Term.

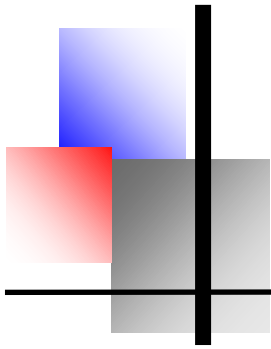
The International School and Community College always welcomes visitors. If you cannot come to the Open Days please telephone school to arrange a visit at a mutually convenient time.

TRANSITION

If your child is successful in gaining a place at The International School and Community College we have a well established induction programme which begins whilst your child is in Year 6. This has been built upon through strong links with local primary schools.

Students will have an opportunity to spend a whole day in school in the Summer Term, where they will sample a number of lessons and meet staff.

You will be invited to attend an Induction Evening, where you will have an opportunity to meet staff and share any concerns that you may have. The Learning Support Faculty will be present, or alternatively, we are able to arrange for individual meetings at other times.

Life Long Learning

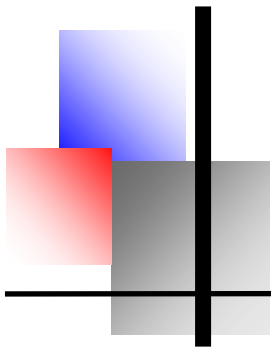

Other opportunities

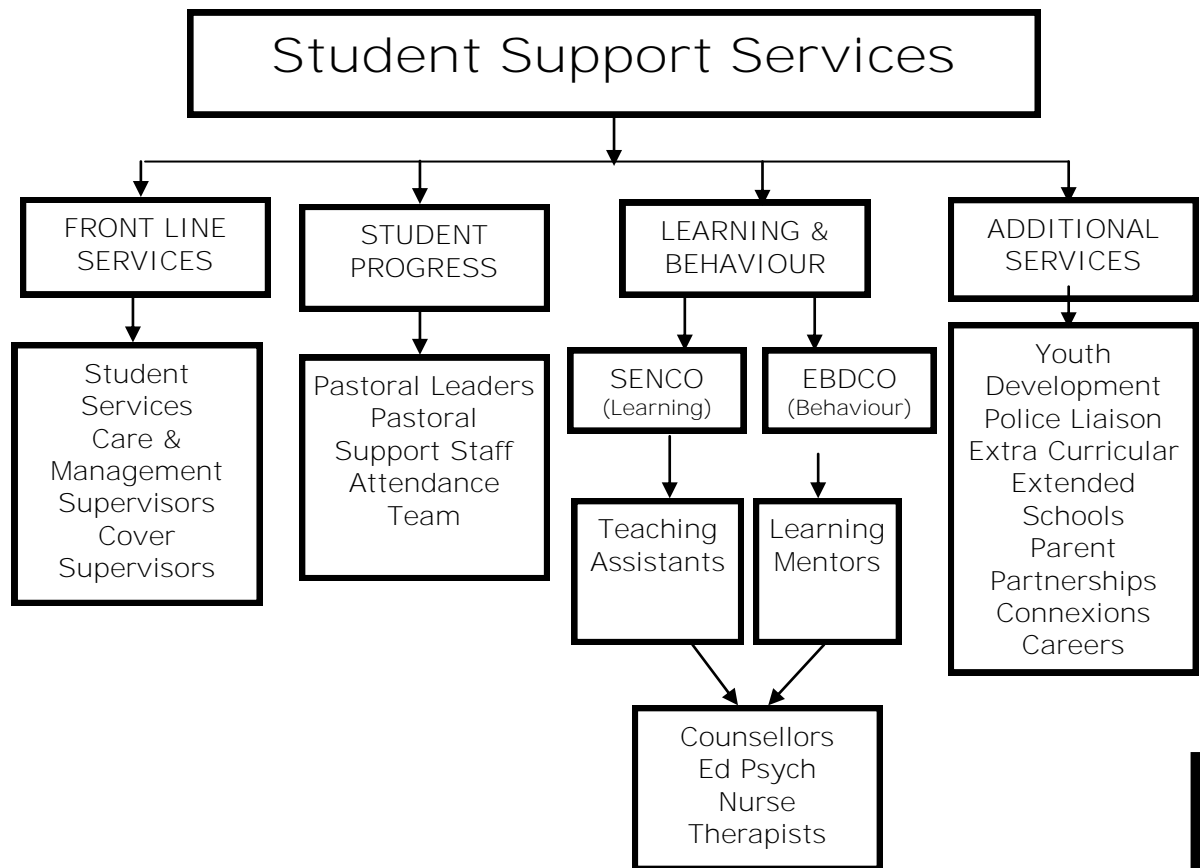

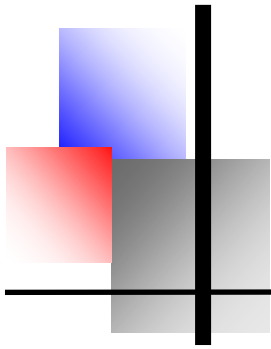




Students with Extra special needs

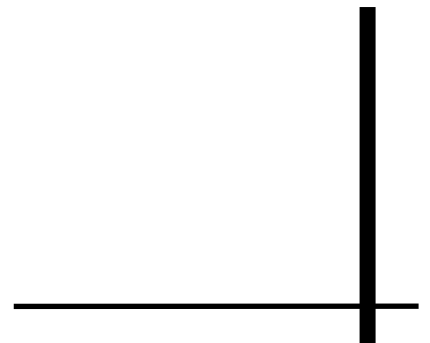

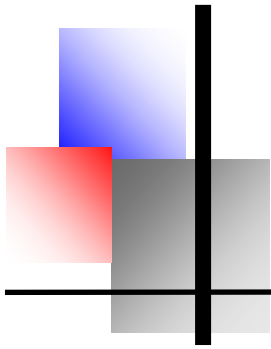

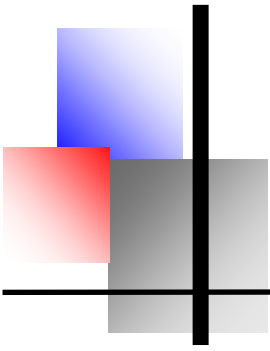
