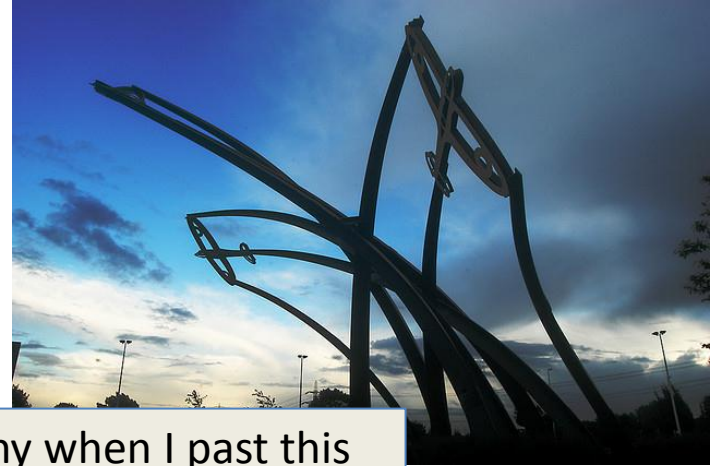
## 2. Sikander Hussain Year 7 Cadbury Wenlock
